RWWL & CAU Department of Political Science Produce a New Online Journal!

The Robert W. Woodruff Library (RWWL) of the Atlanta University Center (AUC) and Clark Atlanta University's Department of Political Science collaborated during the fall semester to produce a new online journal, *Endarch: Journal of Black Political Research*. Formerly a print publication, *Endarch* is now published online through the Library's DigitalCommons institutional repository <http://digitalcommons.auctr.edu>.

Endarch is a peer reviewed journal produced under the editorial direction of Alecia Hoffman, a Clark Atlanta University graduate student in the Department of Political Science. The newest volume, Fall 2008, and several historical issues are now available online and are full text searchable. This journal is the AUC's first scholarly student journal to be produced in digital format using the RWWL repository.

The DigitalCommons repository assists in the discovery of the collective body of research emanating from the Atlanta University Center. By utilizing technology that facilitates the creation, publication and preservation of research in digital form, RWWL is able to promote, provide access to and preserve the scholarship produced by the faculty and students of the AUC.
